## Today Is Not That Day by Robert Royal

You've probably heard it too: "This country is not worth fighting for — let alone dying for — anymore. It's too corrupt and broken. It's finished." You even hear it from disheartened people who served in the armed forces or lost loved ones in war. On Memorial Day, as we honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice for us, we need to sort out what's true about that feeling — the part that makes it partly true — from what's false — the temptation to surrender to things to which we should never surrender.

Let's approach this subject as Catholics, in the steadying light of the Church's long experience, not in the ways that the hysterics in the media and our public life use these days to exploit us. There may always come a day when a beloved nation is no longer worth defending. It can cross a line from troubled legitimacy (which is what all governments always are) into outright illegitimacy.

But today is not that day.

Some thought America crossed that line in 1973 with *Roe v. Wade*. How can a government that legally permits the killing of innocents remain legitimate?

And it didn't stop there.

A famous symposium in *First Things* in 1996, asked whether we were seeing "The End of Democracy?" Several writers ... lamented "the judicial usurpation of politics" in further court decisions (which have since multiplied). They questioned whether our system could be justified — or fixed — any longer. It was a powerful, if controversial, argument at the time. And it hasn't gone away.

Yet here we are, over a quarter-century later, likely to see in just a few weeks the reversal of *Roe*.

Many battles were fought to bring us to this point. Even so, the battle over abortion and many other evils is not finished, and never will be, because evil and error regrow, like poisonous weeds, on any ground that we leave untreated.

No Christian should be surprised at this. We live in a fallen world. The effects of Original Sin continue to unspool everywhere. And it's a utopian fantasy to think that it's abnormal when evils threaten us on every side. If you need Biblical warrant, here's Saint Peter, "Beloved, do not be surprised that a trial by fire is occurring

among you, as if something strange were happening to you." (I Peter 4:12)

Pursuing good and repelling evil are the warp and woof of human life.

Lately, we've been dealing with another fantasy: the un-Christian and adolescent notion that real or alleged flaws in our American past, and in our whole Western civilization — slavery, racism, inequality, "homophobia," etc. — are unique to just one part of the human race — whites, men, colonizers, and (yes) Christians. And delegitimize the country.

The slightest knowledge of American and human history — and even a glance around the world today would show — that simply isn't true. But it's one measure of how blind the radical critics have become that they don't appreciate the many other things (Christianity among them) that have made our history, for all its flaws, different. And better.

Even worse, the newly "woke" believe they themselves are free from sin and able to take us to a better place.

This is something new. And it stems directly from the rejection of Christianity and, therefore, a failure to see what's real. All of us have done things we shouldn't have. And, if we're decent people, regret it. Becoming an adult means acknowledging those failures — and their continuing effects in our lives — and learning to work on our own imperfections. And to forgive others trying to work through theirs.

Multiply our individual lives times the billions of people on earth — not all sincerely trying to do better — and it's no wonder that human history presents such a melancholy spectacle.

There are times when the faults come bubbling more obviously to the surface, sometimes many at once. We're at such a moment now. But only the very young, whatever their chronological age, are under the illusion that some society exists somewhere without our shortcomings. Or that now "woke" themselves, they can bring one about soon.

Take our most neuralgic issue just now: racism. By any objective measures, America is one of the least racist nations on earth. And outside the media bubble, the races accept each other more than ever. Which is one of the reasons why our Southern border is jammed with people of all races trying to get in.

At least 360,000 Northerners died in the Civil War to bring an end to slavery and

preserve our Union (200,000 Catholics fought in that war). And from that bloody struggle, we have moved towards greater equality among all races. The fact that such a struggle continues is not a sign that we've failed, but that we're still striving to do even better.

We're also struggling on many other painful fronts, of course. Some Christians these days even talk idly about civil war and secession, given our moral problems and social divisions. But this is a false solution. Our great dead — in the Revolution, the Civil War, and more recent conflicts — remind us of what it has cost just to maintain union and a tolerable level of human decency.

We know more than ever on Memorial Day how the gifts of freedom may be taken for granted, distorted, mocked, and misused to justify vice and decadence. The day may come when those evils become too great to bear. But today is not that day.

We cannot surrender to despair. There's still too much good in our people and institutions to let them go without a fight. We're not naïve. We've always known we're less than perfect. And that at some point, as Ben Franklin warned right after the ratification of the Constitution, we can lose it all. But today is not that day.

Indeed, a time may come when it's no longer worth sacrificing for America. Pray it will never come. But today is not that day.

## Nancy Pelosi Is Blessed by Fr. Gerald E. Murray

House Speaker Nancy Pelosi of San Francisco may not realize it, but she is blessed to have a true pastor of souls as her bishop. Archbishop Salvatore Cordileone's love for her as a member of his flock prompted him to tell her something she does not want to hear, namely that she will not be allowed to receive Holy Communion in her home diocese until she has repented of her gravely sinful promotion of the killing of unborn children by abortion.

The duty of a bishop is not to humor a member of his flock, such as Mrs. Pelosi, who claims that her promotion of abortion is not in contradiction to her obligations as a follower of Christ in the Catholic Church. His duty is to lead his flock in the path of truth and virtue, which at times means rebuking someone who contradicts Christ's Truth in a matter of great importance. This episcopal duty is not simply a matter of exhorting someone to abandon wrongful ways. In the case of Speaker Pelosi such exhortations by Archbishop Cordileone have been frequent, and completely ignored.

Canon 915 requires a bishop to safeguard the sanctity of the Holy Eucharist, to prevent scandal being given to the faithful, and to promote the eternal welfare of the soul of one "who obstinately persist[s] in manifest grave sin" by not admitting that person to the reception of Holy Communion. This rebuke is designed to shake the offending person out of the mistaken conviction that his behavior is not only not sinful, but rather somehow virtuous, and therefore pleasing to God. Pro-abortion Catholics such as Mrs. Pelosi constantly claim that abortion is good and not evil and that, as such, women have a fundamental right to abortion that may not be justly taken from them.

The Catholic Church teaches that nothing could be farther from the truth.

The authority granted to bishops in canon 915 is a holy and legitimate use of coercive power. Coercion in the Church is used by the shepherds to protect the

flock from sin and error. The bishop's staff has a crook on the top, designed to allow him to grab a wandering sheep around the neck and pull it to safety. It also has a pointed end at the bottom to allow him to ward off attacking wolves, but also to prod recalcitrant sheep to move in the right direction.

It would be nice if the sheep always obeyed the voice of the shepherd and followed his direction on the Church's pilgrimage through this world towards the next. But sadly, the sheep do not always follow the lead of the shepherd who insistently calls back those who stubbornly wander off. Such obstinacy in refusing to be led into the ways of Truth and holiness poses a direct threat to them and to other sheep who might follow them and not the True Shepherd.

In such cases, the only charitable thing for the shepherd to do is to use his God-given authority to impress upon the wandering sheep that Christian love does not equal tolerance of error and grave immorality. The shock of being told that she will not be given Holy Communion in her home archdiocese is salutary for Mrs. Pelosi. If heeded, it will be life-changing for the better.

A strange temptation of our times is to view Catholicism not as a revealed religion that makes demands upon those who believe in it, but rather as an individual experience of what matters most to a person, with no necessary connection to what any Church authority might say or do. In this scenario, bishops and priests are there to fulfill a largely decorative role in the lives of the faithful. But each Catholic gets to decide what he or she will believe in.

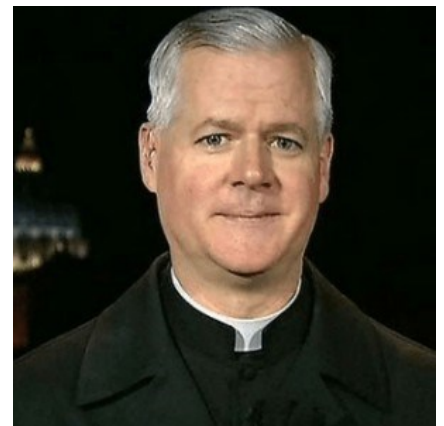
The courageous action taken by Archbishop Cordileone is a much-needed rebuke of this individualistic deformation of what it means to be a Catholic. No one gets to re-write the Bible or the moral law. No one gets to use his or her position of authority and influence in society to teach the false lesson that abortion and other sinful practices are good and do not offend God. No one gets to reject publicly and obstinately the clear and unambiguous teaching of the Church that abortion is

gravely immoral without placing his or her soul in grave danger of eternal perdition.

The denial of Holy Communion to Speaker Pelosi is a warning to her and to everyone who agrees with her that the discomfort occasioned by such a serious measure is a mere foretaste of the eternal discomfort that awaits those who freely and knowingly reject the commandment of God not to kill innocent human life. Archbishop Cordileone knows that she will be annoyed and upset by his action. He knows that he has finally gotten her attention after years of her ignoring his warnings about her vehement public support of the intrinsically evil practice of abortion.

She stands at a crossroads, and it behooves her to stop and reflect on what is happening. Her shepherd is trying to free her from the grip of an erroneous conscience. Her shepherd is doing nothing less than what we should all want our shepherds to do, that is, teach the truth of Christ and guard the flock from error and vice. We must pray that she comes to understand that Archbishop Cordileone loves her and, by his prohibition, is trying to lead her away from the abyss of sin and death.

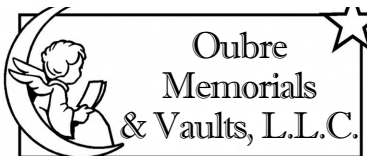
